Frequently asked questions

We recognise that there are still some families for whom accessing online learning is still problematic. This week we are sharing some FAQ to support anyone who is still struggling.

1. How does my child find out which lessons to attend?

2. I keep getting notifications on Google Guardians that my child has not submitted their work on Google Classroom


There are two reasons for this:

- a) They are not doing the work and not submitting it
- b) They are producing their work but not submitting it in the right place


Most students are now taking pictures of their work and uploading to the Google Classroom. Here is how to do this successfully so that Google will register that you have done the work and your teacher can then easily see it.

Step 1 - student logs onto their Google account on their phone (if your child still doesn't know how to do this please contact your Head of Year and someone will call home to help)


Step 2 - they click on the Google Classroom they wish to submit work to (this is an example from my maths class in Y11)




Step 3 - student clicks on the tab saying classwork - they will then see all of their assignments




Step 4 - click on the assignment that you want to upload work to




Step 5 - Click on view assignment



Step 6 - In the Your work box then click on the +add or create button




Step 7 - Click on file and browse on your phone to find the photo you want to upload





..... and then click on open

(note I am working on my desktop to do this not my phone but it is the same process)



Step 8 - Then simply hand in by following these two steps. Your teacher will then see the work and it will be logged on the Google platform





3. Why do I keep getting messages on Schoolcomms that my child has not attended lessons or is not engaging in their remote learning?

This will be for one of two reasons

- a) We are monitoring daily attendance at live lessons and this is why we have been so swift at getting devices out to families to provide children the means to attend their lessons on something other than a phone
- b) We are also monitoring engagement on a weekly basis. This is different. We know that some children have not had a device or been sharing with a sibling and therefore have not been able to attend live lessons. However, they have accessed the assignments and handed them in by coming to the classroom at another more suitable time. Teachers are grading work on a RAG (Red, Amber, Green) basis and we will be starting to send out letters to parents where we have concerns or where we are incredibly pleased with the engagement of their children.
