Garden Birdwatch

The RSPB Garden Birdwatch will take place this year between 28-30 January. It is a challenge to spot as many birds in your garden or local park in an hour and identify the species. However, make sure to only count the bird once (for example, if you see nine sparrows at one time, this would be recorded as nine, but if the next time you saw eight it would not count as they are probably the same birds. If there are nine and then twelve, the amount would be upgraded to twelve because there are more birds than you have already seen. Attempt to group the birds by species, for example in this table:

Sparrow - 12

Robin - 2

Starling - 6

Bluetit - 1

Instead of all together, like this table:

Birds= 21

Also, the bird must land in the area, it cannot be counted flying.

Remember to report your results to the RSPB, as this will help crucial conservation across the UK (the link for the RSPB website is below)
