What is Quizzing?



Quizzing is an effective way to revise individual topics or units of work in small and manageable bursts of revision time.

It involves completing a series of short answer questions or 'quiz' on a particular area of study and offers immediate feedback to students on whether they have achieved the correct answer or application of knowledge.

Quizzing is also a great tool for students to complete revision with friends. It offers the opportunity to students to create questions on a particular topic or area of weakness and test their friends. Creating their own questions helps students think of how an exam question might be presented.

What are the benefits of quizzing and why it works?

1. **Quizzing is a great way of targeting a specific topic or area of study.**
Students can focus on one topic at a time focus on areas they do not feel they have mastered yet.
2. **Short and Snappy revision** - Quizzes can be created or completed very quickly which means students are not spending hours on more lengthy revision strategies.
3. **Repetition supports memory** - Completing multiple quizzes or creating questions on the same topic supports retention and retrieval of knowledge. Makes us review information so that we forget less and retain more.
4. **Encourages self awareness of progress** - pupils get instant feedback on their responses. And this can help them identify areas they need to develop themselves and highlight progress for them to be proud of.

Students start to think about what an exam question might look like. Great for revision with a friend as they can swap and assess each others.



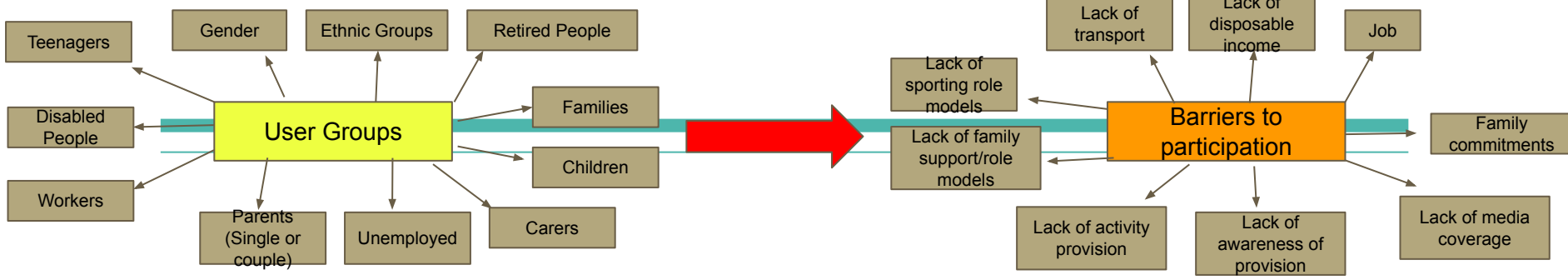
